60.01 PURPOSE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Blair recognizes its responsibilities under Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and endorses the concepts of fair and open housing for all person and prohibition of discrimination therein;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT:

- 1) The City of Blair hereby adopts Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and all subsequent amendments thereto.
- 2) The officials and employees of the City of Blair shall assist in the orderly prevention and removal of all discrimination in housing within the City municipal jurisdiction by implementing the authority and enforcement procedures set forth in Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended.
- 3) The Municipal Clerk shall maintain forms for complaints to be filed under Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and shall assist any person alleging a violation thereof in the City of Blair to file a complaint thereunder with the Wisconsin Department of Work Force Development, Equal Rights Division, for enforcement of Section 106.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended.

60.02 ADOPTION OF STATE STATUTE.

- (1) The City of Blair hereby adopts Section 106.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, as if fully restated herein, including all subsequent amendments thereto.

60.03 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

- (1) The officials and employees of the City of Blair shall assist in the orderly prevention and removal of all discrimination in housing within the City's municipal jurisdiction by implementing the authority and enforcement procedures as set forth in Section 106.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended.
- (2) The municipal Clerk shall maintain forms for complaints to be filed under Section 106.40 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and shall reasonably assist any person alleging a violation thereof within the City of Blair to file a complaint thereunder with the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development, Equal

Rights Division, or other appropriate state agency, for enforcement of Section 106.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended.

60.04 PENALTIES:

- (1) Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for offense.
