7.01 ELECTIONS

- (1) Nominations for candidates for city offices shall be as set forth in Section 8.10, Wis. Stat., herein incorporated by reference
- (2) A primary election may be held pursuant to Section 8.11(1), Wis. Stat., herein incorporated by reference.
- (3) The conduct of elections shall be consistent with various provisions of Chapter 5, Wis. Stat.
- (4) The polls at any election shall be open from 7:00 A.M. until 8:00 P.M.
- (5) The polling place for all elections, for all wards within the City, shall be City Hall.
- (6) Ballots shall be prepared in the manner and form called for by Wisconsin law. Special ballots on local referenda shall be prepared under the direction of the City Council.
- (7) Voting machines shall be used in all elections except for special ballots, which cannot be programmed into the voting machine.
- (8) General elections for offices other than city offices shall be conducted in the manner and form called for by Wisconsin law.

7.02 SPECIAL ELECTIONS

- (1) Special elections to fill vacancies not otherwise filled by appointment may be called by action of the City Council.
- (2) Special elections for offices, other than city offices, shall be conducted in a manner and form called for by Wisconsin law.

7.03 ELECTION OFFICIALS

The selection, conduct and duties of election officials shall be as specified in Chapter 7 of the Wisconsin Statutes, unless modified by these ordinances. Compensation for election officials shall be set by action of the City Council.

7.04 ELECTORS

- (1) Every U.S. citizen, age eighteen (18) years of age or older, not under legal guardianship, who has resided in the City of Blair for ten (10) days prior to any election is an eligible voter or elector.
- (2) Residence as a qualification for voting is defined in Sec. 6.10, Wis. Stat., herein incorporated by reference.
- (3) Registration to vote is not required prior to any election to vote. A person, if eligible to vote, may do so by presenting himself at the polling place during the hours set for voting in any given election.
- (4) Absentee voting shall be conducted as authorized by applicable Wisconsin law.
- (5) Challenges to the right of any elector to cast a vote shall be as provided by applicable Wisconsin law.
