43.01 ADOPTION OF COUNTY ORDINANCE.

Trempealeau County adopted an Ordinance relative to the regulation of large gatherings, commonly referred to as the Rock Festival Ordinance, being dated July 21, 1970, and published and effective as of July 30, 1970. The Trempealeau County Ordinance is hereby incorporated by reference and adopted herein as if set forth on these pages.

43.02 EXCEPTIONS.

- (1) References in the County Ordinances to the Trempealeau County Board are hereby changed to read City Council.
- (2) References in the county ordinance to the Law Enforcement Committee are hereby changed to be designated standing committee, as designated by the Council.
- (3) Reference made in the County Ordinance to the assembly of five thousand (5,000) or more people is hereby changed to the assembly of three thousand (3,000) or more people.
- (4) Reference made in the County Ordinance to a license fee of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) is hereby changed to one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the license fee.
- (5) Reference made in the County Ordinance to the filing of a bond equivalent to two dollars (\$2.00) per person is hereby changed to the equivalent of five dollars (\$5.00) per person for bonding.

43.03 EXEMPTIONS.

- (1) The policy of this Ordinance is to provide for the health, safety and public good in the regulation of large gatherings. It is not the intent to hinder, prevent or stifle traditional or fund raising activities sponsored by community organizations. To provide a blanket exemption to an organization however, would be contrary to the intent and spirit of the policy.
- (2) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the following activities are hereby declared exempt:
 - (a) Blair Cheese Festival sponsored by Blair Festivals, Inc.
 - (b) Ice Fishing Contest sponsored by American Legion Post No. 231.
 - (c) Agricultural events and related activity sponsored by FFA Alumni Association.

- (3) The exemption provided in subparagraph 2 will not apply to any of the named sponsoring organizations should they promote and / or sponsor an activity, which would otherwise be prohibited by this Ordinance.
